

How to Make and Document Authentic SCA Beer <u>by Lord Ivarr Siguroarson</u>

Equipment

- Turkey deep-frying kettle
- Propane burner stand
- 10 gal water
- · Floating thermometer
- Large stirring spoon or paddle
- 3lb bag of Barley or Rye
- Dry yeast bread packet
- Small side table
- Camera
- \$15.00 US

Procedure

- Set up propane burner stand and set kettle on top
- Set up side table next to the burner stand
- Lay out ingredients, stirring spoon and thermometer on table so they are neatly arranged
- Take photo for documentation purposes

THE SIX BASIC ARCHERY SAFETY RULES By Eldwin Nightowl

This article is not intended to be taken seriously. Please follow all proper safety precautions when using a bow, arrow, and/or string. This piece is a parody of "The Six Basic Gun Safety Rules" provided by the State of California. Which is in Caid. Partially.


- 1) Treat all archery bows as if they are loaded with an arrow. Note that a bow found on the top of a birthday present or someone's head is not an archery bow. Usually. And an archery bow is not the same as a violin bow. A violin bow is a long, thin rod with even thinner material stretched from end to end. An archery bow is a long, thin rod with even thinner material stretched from end to end. Know the difference. Always assume that a bow has an arrow on its string even if you don't see or feel an arrow or a string. Or a bow. If you are unable to check a bow to tell if it has a string or arrow, leave it alone and seek help. You probably need it.
- 2) Always keep an arrow, whether on a bow or not, pointed in the safest possible direction. If you don't know the safest direction, ask a herald for a map. Always be aware of where an arrow is pointing. A "safe direction" is NOT one where there is a king, queen, baron, baroness, lord, lady, other SCA member, visitor, or member of the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department. Only point a bow loaded with an arrow at an object you intend to shoot. Never point a loaded bow at yourself as trying to do so can really twist your arms. In a war using an officially safety-approved combat bow and arrow, only shoot at the properly-armoured bad guys.
- 3) Keep your fingers off the bowstring and don't pull it until you are ready to shoot. Otherwise you can wear out your arms. If you don't know what to do with your fingers, and your hands are properly sanitized, you may put them in your mouth. But only if you promise not to bite. And be careful handling any bow drawn by someone who's not as skilled at drawing as a Laurel. Also remember that, if you are moving around while your fingers are on the bowstring and you stumble or fall, you could inadvertently release the string. For this reason, do not hold a loaded bow at an SCA revel while dancing. You don't want to shoot yourself in the foot.
- 4) Know your target. Usually it's a round thing. And it often has different colored circles. But check with a marshal first to be sure. That round thing could be someone's latest award. Or their coronet. Or their crown. Or a cloved lemon. Do not fire at anything unless you're absolutely certain it's safe. But don't fire at a safe. The arrow could bounce off a metal safe and hurt somebody. That's not safe. And never fire at a target that is only a movement, color, sound, or unidentified noble. Be aware of all the people around you before you shoot, and make certain they are aware of you. That way you'll know they can see you show off.
- 5) Know how to properly operate your bow and arrow. Otherwise, while on the archery range, you're going to look pretty foolish. It is important to become thoroughly familiar with your bow, arrow, and string. Here is an identification guide. The bow is the long thin thing that can bend. The string is the long thin thing that can bend. Now you know which is which.
- 6) Store your bow safely and securely to prevent unauthorized use. Bows and arrows should be stored separately. (When unsupervised, they have a tendency to fight). And do not mistake the bow string for a shoe string. Or a potato string. Or a G string (that's something found on a bard's guitar). When the bow is not in your hands, you must still think of safety. (Some of those fighters can get kind of crazy. One of them might want to use your bow for "being hit on the head lessons." That is not safe.) Also remember that when you bow in respect to a noble, make certain your bow is unloaded. You don't want to shoot yourself in the foot.

Disguised as mild-mannered 21st century reporter Alden Loveshade, Eldwin fights a never-ending battle for truthiness, just-kidding, and the SCAdian way! But, unfortunately, he's not faster than a speeding arrow. So don't shoot!
