Dearest Dreiburgen!



### A (very) Brief History on Medieval Usage

Fireworks to most people are colorful celebratory aerial displays of geometric patterns. Initially developed – by accident – by the Chinese around first century AD for religious festivals, these 'fire-sticks' were eventually transformed into military use.

The first reported use was in 1232 at the Battle of Kai-Keng when the Chinese repelled a Mongol invasion by firing a barrage of arrows of flying fire for mostly psychological effect (PsyWar).<sup>1</sup>

In the 14th and 15th centuries, Englishman Roger Improved gunpowder for longer range, Frenchman Jean Froissart designed a more accurate flight method for 'rockets', and Joanes de Fontana of Italy designed a surface-running rocket-powered torpedo for setting enemy ships on fire. <sup>1</sup>

Gunpowder traveled west when European and Arabian diplomats and missionaries began visiting China around this time. Like their Chinese counterparts, Western engineers also developed weapons -- this time, muskets and cannons -- but continued to develop fireworks, and they became larger and more elaborate.<sup>2</sup>

These 'rockets' fell into disuse as weapons of war in the 16th century but still used for celebratory

firework displays. If you attended a fireworks show in 1600, the science would not have been much different from ancient China, but it was a lot more entertaining!

Aerial fireworks (still plain orange -- no color yet!) were run by "firemasters" and their assistants, "green men", named for the leaves they wore to protect themselves from sparks.<sup>2</sup>




